Over the years, Echo Network Africa (ENA) has been at the forefront on the women empowerment agenda, working with various stakeholders to achieve its mandate.

ENA's commitment to attain gender equity and equality is aligned to various National and International legal and policy provisions and requirements for compliance. Gender equality is internationally recognized as a human right. ENA seeks to promote protection of women dignity and human rights and contribute to the elimination of poverty and injustice for both women and men. ENA also calls for adequate representation of women and girls in leadership and governance positions. This is aimed at catalyzing effective women and girls representation in decision making spaces e.g. political systems in public institutions while reducing the high prevalence of Gender Based Violence (GBV).

The amplification of women's voices in leadership is critical towards the realization of a gender inclusive society. It is for this reason that ENA recently launched the 'Chagua Mama' or 'Elect Her' campaign intended to raise awareness among the electorate on the need to elect women into political leadership.

Further, through the African Women Leaders Network, Presidential candidates have been urged to consider choosing a woman as their running mate and to advocate for peaceful elections.

The task of preserving peace and national unity is a mammoth task that cannot be done by one individual or a group of people on their own. Neither the Presidency, Legislature, Judiciary or even the citizenry can achieve much on their own. As Kenya gears up towards the 9th August 2022 General Elections, seeds of discord have continued to be planted. This month women of Kenya under the auspices of the African Women Leaders Network (AWLN) - Kenya Chapter held a press conference to decry the recent incidents of violence and the normalization of various forms of violence in the country.

Political driven violence has been a major concern and specifically threats from various quarters following the incidents on the stoning of the presidential aspirants' entourage.

The purpose of the press conference was to condemn such occurrences, while urging different parties including politicians and their supporters to maintain sobriety and desist from retaliating.

'We have witnessed inflammatory hate attacks directed at the former First Lady Mama Ngina Kenyatta. The utterances were as distasteful as they were unfortunate," said Dr. Riria.

She equally condemned the inciteful and hateful utterances that were witnessed both in the country and from Kenyans in the diaspora.

Dr. Riria reminded presidential aspirants that they bear the highest responsibility on behalf of their followers to maintain peace.

The press conference also addressed on the need for all communities to be watchdogs and to speak out on any organization of violence. The forum was a call to action for Kenyans to help identify perpetrators of violence and to report them to authorities.

ENA'S KAUGEGE WOMEN GROUP REAP BOUNTIFUL HARVEST

Echo Network Africa's Women Empowerment focus area seeks to enhance sustainable livelihoods and empowerment of rural women and their families. The focus area positions women through strengthening women's voices to reduce human rights violations along the aquaculture value chain and enhances participation of women in aquaculture as a sustainable economic activity.

The Aquaculture initiative has been implemented in Homa Bay County in four beaches namely Litare, Wakula, Kaugege and Mrongo targeting 100 women comprising of 25 women each from the four beaches.

This month women from Kaugege beach harvested a total of 5,176.20 kgs equivalent to 5.2 tonnes of fish.The bountiful harvest will play a crucial role in cushioning the women from exploitation by fishermen who have a higher bargaining power when it comes to wild capture fish production. ENA uses Anchor Cluster Model, where women already practicing cage fish farming are empowered as champions to mentor other women engaging in the fishing activity.

ENA EMPOWERS COMMUNITY CHAMPIONS

ENA's Girls Excel Initiative uses a three-pronged approach to leverage on meaningful engagement of community members, technology and economic empowerment to reduce incidences of female genital mutilation (FGM), child, early and forced marriage (CEFM), and teenage pregnancies.

To guarantee effective community engagement, the project identified community champions drawn from religious leaders, the Maa council of elders and other opinion shapers in the community.

The identified Champions who are also the community gate keepers will steer monthly community conversations which will seek to

address the issues of FGM, CEFM and teenage pregnancies through co-creation and monitoring of score cards that outline desirable behavior.

In preparation for this role a team of 24 champions (12 female and 12 Male) participated in a 3-day training facilitated by Echo Network Africa.

The training which seeks to empower the gatekeepers focused on:

- Community perceptions regarding FGM,
- Impact of FGM,
- Legal frameworks and Referral Pathways,
- Role of Champions in the project and
- Mapping out champion outreach units
