ENA's Journey to ending the Jaboya Practice

Women's Resilience & Livelihood

Leave no one behind is the central, transformative promise of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It represents the unequivocal commitment of all UN Member States to eradicate poverty in all its forms, end discrimination and exclusion, and reduce the inequalities and vulnerabilities that undermine the potential of individuals and of humanity as a whole.

Despite the adverse challenges affecting girls and women among them; cultural norms, limited resource allocation, lack of opportunities and underrepresentation, women have continued to strive in their businesses.

The second phase of the Aqua culture cluster model began last year. ENA leveraged on its past experience on aquaculture by enhancing sustainable livelihoods and increasing meaningful participation of women in the aquaculture value chain.

On 31st October 2022, ENA GCEO Dr. Jennifer Riria together with Mr. Jacob Obonyo from National Affirmative Action Fund representing Governor Homa Bay County H.E Gladys Wanga officially launched the Aquaculture Fish Production technological equipment.

This was in collaboration with MEDA Kenya through the Maendeleo Sawa (M-SAWA) project to enhance SMEs fish production through capacity building. Fish Farmers in 4 beaches (Wakula, Kaugege, Mrongo and Litare) have acquired fish production technological equipment including: Solar freezers for fish Preservation, Fish feeds processing machines, Engine Motor boats for fish feeds and harvest transportation and Solar flood lights to enhance security.

The equipment is meant to enhance fish production for women to increase their revenue streams, enhance food security and improve their livelihoods. To date, 79 women have benefitted from this initiative.

ENA empowers women in Narok County through Financial Literacy Trainings

Girls Excel Initiative

74 women drawn from 8 groups in Narok County were this month trained by Echo Network Africa on Financial Literacy, Management skills and Group dynamics. This was preceded by group assessment and vetting to identify the legitimate and creditworthy groups.

A total of 18 women groups were mapped, 15 groups were assessed and 8 groups selected for the training and access to credit. To ensure that there were no language barriers, the women groups were trained in Maa Language as most of them were illiterate and could only speak in their mother tongue.

To guarantee the sustainability of the project, the women have since applied for small loans from ENA's revolving loan fund to enable them start their small businesses. The women from the selected groups have particularly shown keen interest in investing in livestock rearing, which is their economic mainstay.

Beneficiaries from the initiative have registered their sincere gratitude for the opportunity to be empowered and one of the women groups is proud to be the first in their village to receive formal financial literacy trainings.

Chagua Mama; More Women Leading after 2022 General Election

Women's Leadership, Political Participation & Governance

On 18th October 2022, Echo Network Africa (ENA) in partnership with UN Women Kenya convened a monitoring mission in Kisumu County with nine women beneficiaries and one male champion. Kisumu was one of the eight target counties during the implementation of the Accelerating Attainment of Gender Inclusive Leadership in Kenya in the 2022 General Elections Project.

The project which was dubbed the Chagua Mama; Chagua Amani Campaign seeks to strengthen the collective voices of women leaders as agents of societal change and increase the number of women of all ages to participate in decision making processes and in political leadership.

This was achieved by increasing the pool of women participating in the 2022 General

Elections and competing for all elective positions including the non-affirmative action positions at the National and County levels.

Ms. Marceline Nyambala, Programmes Manager, Positioning and Democracy Program at ENA opened up discussions and shared the roles ENA and her LIP Democracy Trust Fund played towards building the capacities of women and providing campaign support (Chagua Mama lesos, Badges, T-Shirts, caps, Bags, dignity packs and booklets) to women candidates in the build up to the 2022 General Elections.

She noted that through the strategic partnership with the UN Women, there had been an increase in the number of women elected in the 2022 General Election compared to previous years as illustrated below:
